The conclusion of the Chauvin trial has reminded us that the fight for racial justice is never complete.


The Nebraska Coalition is committed to creating a safer, more equitable state for everyone.

RANNDAY Won't Stay Quiet.

Each April, we recognize Sexual Assault Awareness Month. This moment provides us the opportunity to call attention to the epidemic of sexual violence that exists in our communities.

It spans neighborhoods, college-campuses, and the workplace. It impacts women, men, and non-binary folx. Sexual assault creates an immediate and long-lasting impact on its victims, and minimal repercussions to those who create violence.





Every 73 seconds, another American is sexually assaulted. Every nine minutes, that person is a child.

One in six women have been the victim of sexual violence. Women on college campuses are three times more likely to be victimized.

75% of sexual assaults go unreported. While those decisions are varied and complex, we know that a broken justice system holds the bulk of the blame.




